Risk Management for ISO 9001:2015

Ron Kingen will discuss Risk Analysis, a new major focus of ISO 9001 2015. Ron is currently helping organizations revise their Quality Management Systems to align with the ISO 9001 2015 standard.

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

Ronald Kingen is Founder and President of Continual Value Improvement (CVI) Group, LLC, a professional services consulting practice focused on assisting organizations achieve Sustainable Excellence. He is also a Chairman of Wellness Grub, LLC. He has over 40 years of leadership experience in global high tech organizations.

Ron is Past President and Chair of the Board of the American Society for Quality (ASQ). He also served ASQ as Treasurer; Chair of the Certification and Awards Boards; Chair, Honorary Member Committee; and Chair, Social Responsibility Advisory Council. In addition to being an ASQ Fellow he holds ASQ certifications in: Quality Engineering (CQE), Reliability Engineering (CRE), Quality Auditor (CQA), Quality Manager/Organizational Excellence (CQM/OE), Six Sigma Black Belt (CSSBB). He also obtained a Six Black Belt from the Six Sigma Academy and a Master Lean Six Sigma Black Belt from an employer.

Ron has received the "US President's Call to Service Award" for his lifetime of volunteer service and ASQ's Distinguished Service Medal.

Ron led the creation and global deployment of a new product development process (design for Six Sigma) and co-led a supply chain development and assessment process that became world-class benchmarks. Ron was an early voice and leader for the creation of industry wide quality standards for suppliers and the US national quality award. While under his leadership, several different operations were recognized as world-class quality, lean, and high performance team benchmarks, and earned recognition for quality and delivery records from their customers. The same organizations achieved safety records in their industry, won team excellence competitions and one was recognized by Fortune magazine as one of the top-five places to work.

Ron has delivered numerous presentations globally with audiences ranging from internal company presentations to international conference with over 3000 in attendance and topics from high-level statistical analysis, to the future of quality and global sustainability. He spent his early career in the auto industry where he was on the 3-person design team for the first auto computers, the corporate design team for the crash restraint systems and engine management systems. He has worked in the auto, construction equipment, agriculture and truck industries, as well as, high tech electronics and rare earth magnets. He held leadership responsibilities in Reliability Engineering, Quality, Purchasing and Operations.
